

Aaron Swartz (1986-2013)

- * Internet prodigy and activist
- * Co-creator of Reddit at age 14
- * Developer of RSS and Creative Commons
- * Open access advocate and digital freedom fighter



Aaron Swartz core belief

- * Information should be free and accessible to all
- * Knowledge as a public good, not a commodity
- * The internet as a commons, not private property
- * "Information is power. But like all power, there are those who want to keep it for themselves."

The JStor incident

- * Downloaded millions of academic articles from JSTOR at MIT
- * Charged with federal computer crimes, facing up to 35 years in prison
- * Prosecuted aggressively despite JSTOR declining to press charges
- * Swartz died by suicide in 2013, age 26

Locke, Marx, Swartz

- **Locke**: Labor creates property rights → users should own their data
- ***Marx**: Platform owners exploit user labor → collective ownership needed
- *Swartz: Information as commons \rightarrow open access for all
- *The "enough and as good" proviso violated by monopolies

Current battles over Internet Ownership

- *Net neutrality debates
- *Right to repair
- *Data privacy regulations (GDPR, etc.)
- *Antitrust actions against Big Tech
- *AI training on copyrighted/user content
